Dear Prime Minister Martin:

We are writing to inform you that at our recent meeting in Inuvik, Western Premiers discussed a number of issues of importance, not only to the West, but to Canada.

Premiers agreed the North has the potential to become economically self-sustaining. But this potential cannot be realized without a federal commitment to concluding an agreement for the transfer of authority over lands and resources from Canada (Devolution.)

Premiers agreed all jurisdictions should manage and control their resources and the scope and pace of development. They also agreed that they should benefit from that development. For the North, this means completing a fair and equitable Devolution and revenue sharing agreement.

Devolution will ensure Canadians are ready to seize economic opportunities brought about by the development of Northern resources.

As Western Premiers we call on you to make a strong political commitment to conclude meaningful negotiations and a fair Devolution deal without delay.
